#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### **OUR P&C - A CRUCIAL GROUP!**

P&C's are an important group within any school and ours is no exception. The Elderslie High School P&C meets Tuesday Week 3 and Week 7 of each Term at 7pm in the library. This group is a vital component of our school community. Meetings promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, students and teaching staff into close cooperation. Each meeting agenda includes an update from the principal and deputy principals, Student Representative Council and a presentation from one of the schools faculties. teaching Through fundraising the P&C raises funds to support programs and purchasing of educational resources, for example, in 2016, the P&C purchased a "View From the 32<sup>nd</sup> Floor" for every Year 7 student as part of our Literacy initiative and this year the P&C have purchased a 90" TV located in the library.

I wanted to let our school community know how wonderful our very small but supportive P&C is and without them we would not have a parent voice contributing to school decisions and future directions. It does concern me however, that more parents are not attending the P&C meetings. P&C meetings are for parents and the community - a time where parents are given a school update and where they can contribute to key discussions and decision-making. #### **CYBERSAFETY**

Elderslie High School continues to support our students to understand

the importance of safe practices when using the Internet and social media. A number of strategies the school has implemented include a social media policy; a mobile phone and Internet use policy that every student signs on enrolment; school officer police liaison talks; presentations by community organisations; positive behaviour for learning (PBL) lessons on mobile phone use and cyberbullying; year group meetings; and written information provided to students and

It is clear that social media is a part of most of the lives of our students. If I had to guess about how many of our students used, some form of social media I would say well over 90% and probably a similar number would have a profile on a social networking site. Whilst there may be plenty of good things about social media there are also some dangers, as teenagers do not always make the best choices when it comes to posting something to a social media site, and often share more online than they should. It is also evident that what is "posted" on social media can lead to further problems.

I strongly encourage parents to work with us in supporting your child to use social media appropriately, especially since most activity on social media occurs outside school hours. Specifically we have informed students to:

- Not post photos or videos of themselves online,
- Not use their real names,
- Not reveal their birthdates or interests.

#### **P&C Fundraising & Donations**

## Natalie Martin (DP Years 8, 10 & 12) Year 8 and 10 Subject Selection

The school will be holding a Year 8 Subject Assembly and a Year 10 into 11 Subject Selection Night on 7<sup>th</sup> June 2017. Students in both year groups will be issued with a subject selection booklet with information about each course offered and how to complete the online selection process.



Year 8 will receive their booklet during the Subject Assembly (held during the day at school). Year 8 parents are not required to attend the school, however, they will need to read the booklet with their child at home.

Year 10 will be issued with their booklet at the Year into 11 Subject Selection Night. It is expected that parents will attend the Year 10 into 11 evening with their child, as there is important information that needs to be communicated about the Higher School Certificate.

If students are unsure about subjects, they will need to speak to a teacher from the relevant faculty before completing their choices. It is essential that students print out their selections, have it signed by their parents and return it to the Student Admin office by 21<sup>st</sup> June 2017.

#### **Mobile Phone Use**

Every year we have our Police School Liaison Officer speak to students about the appropriate use of phones and a great deal of time is spent working with students to remind them when they have not used their phones responsibly.

Parents and students are reminded that sending or receiving child abuse material is a **crime**. Therefore, it is important that parents monitor their child's phone usage and support the school's policies. A parent information sheet was sent through the Skoolbag App in Week 5 of this term, please access this information and have a discussion with your child about responsible phone usage.

#### **Parent Teacher Night**

Teachers have been busily writing student reports over the last few weeks, Year 7-11 reports will be issued to students on Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> June and the Parent Teacher Night for 7-12 is on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June. Information on how to book appointments will be on the school website and distributed through the Skoolbag App from 13<sup>th</sup> June. All parents are welcome to come along and meet their child's teachers. It is also a good idea to have your child accompany you so that they can listen to the teacher's feedback about their academic progress.

#### **Aboriginal Education**

Recently, Mrs Jeffries and I met with some representatives from Western Sydney University to provide Year 8 indigenous students with the opportunity to join the Pathways to Dreaming Program. This program provides mentoring for students once a month and there is an excursion to the University every term. During the program students will have the opportunity to develop a greater understanding of culture as well as learning about further education beyond high school.

Mr Mani will be taking our students interested in Public Speaking to Parliament House again this year to participate in the Speak Up Competition which we won last year. Fingers crossed for a similar result and thanks to Mr Mani who assists students in writing their speeches and coordinates the excursions.

During Week 5 our senior students met with a representative from Western Sydney University to learn about alternative entry into university. All of our students will be sitting some tests in June as part of this process. At least two students who had not considered a university education are now considering courses for 2018.

Our annual NAIDOC week assembly will be held on Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> June. All parents are welcome to attend this assembly which will be followed by a morning tea. Further details about this will be distributed through the school website and Skoolbag App closer to the date.

#### Positive Behaviour Learning (PBL) Message

The PBL Team have been working hard to develop engaging lessons for Term 2.

Term 2 lessons held during DEAR have/will cover the following areas:

- Week 3: Equality Day. This lesson took place in the lead up to the mufti day for Equality Day in week 4, in support of equality for all regardless of gender identity, cultural background, religious affiliation, etc.
- Week 6: Right Place Right Time. This lesson will encourage students to be at the right place at the right time, for example going to their next class promptly at the signal of the bell; remaining inbounds during lunch and recess.
- Week 9: Positive By-Standing. This lesson will place some responsibility on students to encourage positive behaviour for their peers. This could include encouraging their peers to keep their phone in their bag, following teacher instruction, and not engaging in disruptive behaviour.

PBL lessons are designed to reiterate reflective, responsible, and respectful behaviour in order to promote a cohesive, safe and friendly environment in the school and wider community.
