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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Year 12 Success (Class of 2018)

Our Year 12 students have now completed their HSC examinations and are ready for a well-deserved rest. We were delighted to learn this week that one of our students, Natalie Finlay had been successful in being selected for the prestigious "Texstyle" exhibition. Texstyle only exhibits the very best HSC practical pieces from across the state and Elderslie HS enjoys a long tradition of great success in having students selected for it. On top of this amazing success, Natalie's Design and Technology work was also set aside for the "Shape" exhibition of major works from across the range of subjects offered within the Technological & Applied Studies Key Learning Area. Natalie's hard work throughout the year has most certainly paid off and we congratulate her for these amazing results. In addition, we are eagerly awaiting news of whether Indyana Verter's Body of Work has been included in the Art Express Exhibition. Indyana had already been notified that her Visual Arts work was set aside for this exhibition which is a high honour indeed. Further, one of our groups of Year 12 Drama students narrowly missed out on inclusion in Onstage which is a creative collection of the best dramatic group performances from across NSW. Congratulations also to Mrs Saunders, Ms Golden, Ms Dennis and Ms Gulley for all the guidance they have given these students to help them achieve these great results.

Renovation Update

After 10 months, we are thrilled to have finally completed the renovation and have opened the playground up fully for student use. Staff have also moved back into the refurbished office and the school is really starting to improve in terms of its physical appearance. It should be noted that a number of community members have asked me about the reason other parts of the school were not targeted for the expenditure of these funds. In answer to this question, the renovation took place with State Government funds under the "Schools Renewal Program" in which key spaces were allocated for renovation. This meant that the school's entrance and office were determined to be the areas for renovation and not any other areas that we may have chosen if we'd had the option. Despite this, the new entrance in particular does indeed deliver on what it was meant to achieve: that the office is now far easier to find from the entrance, the student entrance is safer for students to enter through as the students no longer walk along the driveway and the school is altogether more welcoming.

As we work toward the improvement and refreshing of the rest of the Elderslie High School playground and facilities, we are also very pleased to be able to report that our Basketball Courts will undergo a major renovation during the school holidays. This revamp has been collectively planned by key school staff including the PDHPE teachers for quite some time and will result in the resurfacing of the courts beneath the Covered Outdoor Learning Area (COLA) with new basketball rings. The surface will be inlaid with coloured material and contrasting lines. Works should take around 8 weeks, subject to weather and the vast majority of this will occur during the summer break. We are very much looking forward to seeing the improvements when the school year resumes in 2019.

FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPALS Natalie Martin (DP Years 7, 9 & 11) Year 7

Year 7 have completed their final assessments for the year in preparation for the final reporting for 2018. Reports will be issued to students at the Recognition Assembly on 14 December. Parents are invited to attend the Recognition Assemblies where students will be awarded with Academic Achievement, PBL, Attendance and Merit Scheme Awards.

Irresponsible use of social media and mobile phones is an ongoing issue with Year 7. Students are expected to abide by the school Mobile Phone Policy at all times whilst at school. This requires all students to have mobile phones switched off and in their bags during all lessons. Parents can help us to implement this policy by not texting or calling your child during lesson times. Lesson times are available on the school website or in your child's diary. Other advice is to ensure that children are not using their phones after an agreed upon time at night. This habit can be in place consistently whilst the child is young enough to develop healthy lifelong routines to promote successful academic achievement.

If children have been bullied through social media, my advice is to ask your child to refrain from responding, screen shot the message and provide them to the Year Adviser or myself to be followed up. If your child is distressed throughout the day, due to receiving information about other students, then I advise that the child leave their phone at home, so they can focus on their learning rather than becoming involved in unnecessary drama and gossip.

Year 9

Year 9 are currently preparing for their final assessments for the year. Parents are encouraged to come along to the Recognition Assemblies on December 14 where final reports will be issued. Interested students will have the opportunity to attend the excursion to Jamberoo on 12 December provided they have a good behaviour and attendance record.

Mobile phone use in class is a persistent problem with many students in Year 9 finding it hard to resist using their phones. Our school Mobile Phone Policy indicates that students are required to hand their phones to a teacher if they are using it in class. If they refuse to hand the phone to the teacher, there will be consequences, which will involve at the very least a parent phone call. Failure to comply with the school Mobile Phone Policy can lead to suspension for continued disobedience. Whilst mobile phones have many useful functions, they are a distraction from learning in class.

Year 11

Year 11 Recognition Assembly was held on Friday 9 November. Many students were the successful recipients of Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards from the Elderslie High School Recognition of Achievement Scheme. Other students were awarded for being the most outstanding student in their class and for personal best in their Year 11 studies. Students have now successfully progressed into Year 12 and are preparing to complete their first assessment task in their Higher School Certificate year. Mrs Whitfield, Mr Marshall and I will be conducting interviews for those students wishing to drop a subject over the next few weeks. The expectation is that the students will remain in the course until the end of Term 4. They are also required to complete the first assessment task for the subject. Once students have dropped a subject they are required to attend private study where they are expected to use the time wisely towards preparing for assessment tasks and ultimately the HSC.

School Uniform

As we approach the end of the year, we are beginning to see some students coming to school wearing items other than school uniform. I would like to remind parents that students are required to change into the sports uniform both before and after their practical lessons. This is necessary for hygiene and safety reasons. Sports uniforms can often get dirty especially when the ground is damp and students perspire whilst playing sport, so in the absence of showering it is necessary to change back into school uniform for the remainder of the day. The only day that Year 7-10 students can wear sports uniform for the whole day is on Wednesdays as they have sport in the afternoon. For any student out of uniform, they will be followed up by a Head Teacher.

All students and families are reminded that when they are purchasing new school uniform items they should check the website for verification that the items meet the school's uniform requirements. The policy will outline all uniform expectations, especially in regards to appropriate and approved footwear. Our advice is that all parents look at this policy and check before money is spent on the wrong items. We thank you for your support in this matter.

The NSW Constitutional Convention 2018

Earlier this year I was given the opportunity to apply to attend the National Schools Constitutional Convention for Year 11 students. From the hundreds of applications, only approximately 120 students were selected, and I was lucky enough to be one of those students. On 30 October I travelled into the NSW Parliament in Sydney and represented Elderslie High School at this annual event which provides students a forum to discuss and learn further about the Australian Constitution. The day was focused around the Section 44 of the Australian Constitution which relates to disqualifying factors for individuals wishing to be part of federal parliament.

The day began with a lecture from a keynote speaker who enlightened us with her broad knowledge of the constitution, in particular she is an expert in section 44. As a professor and a lawyer, she had an abundance of information and knowledge to share with the large group of intrigued Year 11 students from all across the state. The professor captured our attention explaining in detail each part of section 44 in a manner we could all understand.

With this newly gained knowledge, we then split into smaller groups of about 20-25 students. In these smaller groups we divided into groups to discuss one part of the section before coming together to share ideas and opinions. We were each able to express and share our individual opinions and add stories or anecdotes to contribute to the discussion. By far the two parts where most opinions were shared related to dual citizenship and criminal records. I myself showed the most interest in these two aspects too, with questions being raised such as 'Aren't we all dual citizens in one form or another unless we're Aboriginal?' and 'Australia is a country built on migration, how can we exclude such a large aspect of the population from entering Parliament?' As well as 'What types of criminal convictions are considered a disgualification from being able to enter parliament?' Of course, there were opinions from both sides of the argument to be considered and discussed. This open forum was a great opportunity and experience, to see the points of views from people from so many different walks of life with their own cultures and backgrounds.

At the end of the day, we were each given the opportunity to vote for individuals in our group to go on to the National Convention in Canberra next year, which I unfortunately missed out on. At this time also, we each voted in a mock referendum on whether or not we believe that the dual citizenship aspect of section 44 in the Australian Constitution should be amended. In a double majority, the referendum passed.

Over all, the whole day was an amazing experience. I am incredibly grateful for being given the opportunity to participate in this day. I would highly recommend the day to the next student who is given the opportunity to apply.
