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PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Staffing News

We would like to welcome Ms Therese Wilson to our staff who will be filling the role of Senior Mentor Teacher for the rest of this term at our school. Ms Wilson brings a depth of experience and will provide ongoing support around goal setting and post school transition for our senior students.

From Term 2, we will welcome Ms Michelle Christopher who has been permanently appointed as School Counsellor. At this stage, we understand that Ms Christopher will work opposite Mr Paul O'Reilly in sharing the School Counsellor's role. We thank all our students and parents for their flexibility and understanding while the Department has filled the staffing vacancy at our school as we have not had, in these first weeks of the year, access to a counsellor every day. For the rest of Term 1, we have provided additional support for students through the establishment of a Student Welfare Teacher who provides additional social and emotional support for students across all years. This temporary role is being filled by Mr Scott Atterton, a long-serving member of our school's Welfare Team and our current Year 11 Year Adviser

At the time of writing, the school is also in the process of recruiting a new permanent Mathematics teacher and we should have some more news for our community on this front in the next edition of Parent Bulletin.

Finally, I would like to share with you that one of our highly respected History teachers, Mrs Melissa Bright has been named as a winner of the Premier's Memorial ANZAC Scholarship. The Scholarship is a very prestigious award and allows for the winner to visit key historical sites while accompanying a group of History students drawn from all parts of NSW. The Scholarship is a joint initiative of the Department of Education and the NSW Office for Veteran's Affairs. Congratulations Ms Bright — we know that the experiences you gather while taking up this Scholarship will really benefit your teaching and the tales that Elderslie High School students will hear about in the classroom.

Student Success

We are delighted to announce that our school performed admirably at the Zone Swimming Carnival, held on Friday at Camden Pool. Our school was named the overall winner, defeating the Elizabeth Macarthur High School by over 150 points with Camden HS finishing in third position. At this stage of the year, we have certainly made our first step in our



aim of retaining the Clutha Cup, which is awarded annually to the school who finishes with the most wins across all of the three major carnivals (swimming, cross country and athletics). Elderslie High has held this cup for 20 years and we have every intention of continuing to do so. Thank you to all our sports stars and participants who get involved.

School Development Day Rescheduling

As many parents would know, all public schools hold 5 School Development Days each year, usually on the first day of Terms 1, 2 and 3 and on the last two days of Term 4. Schools are permitted to vary these dates if need be. Parents are advised that in 2019, Elderslie High School plans to alter the end of year arrangements so that the two development days planned for Thursday 19 and Friday 20 December will be held as four half day sessions which will be run as Twilight sessions throughout the year. There will be no additional impact on students as the last day of school is Wednesday 18 December. Parents are also advised that while the school office will be open on Thursday 19 December, it will be closed on Friday 20 December.

Ongoing School Improvements

We are delighted to announce the renovated basketball court area under our COLA is now complete. The vibrant blue surface has made a dramatic and uplifting difference to our playground and comments from the students indicate that they are certainly appreciative as well. Special thanks are due to Mrs Russell, our Business Manager for overseeing the project and Ms George and Mrs Crossingham from the PDHPE Faculty for their involvement as well.

As mentioned in the last edition of Parent Bulletin, Elderslie High School is involved in the Cooler Classrooms program in which all learning spaces are being air-conditioned. This project is well under way and is due for completion at the end of March.

Parent & Citizens Donations

We were delighted to see so many new parents at the first Parents & Citizens meeting for 2019 which was held on 12 February. Our P&C meetings always feature reports from all members of the Senior Executive along with a faculty presentation and report from the SRC. Our P&C is hoping for parent support from across our school community for our ongoing fundraising barbecues. If you can give an hour or so to support these events, that is fantastic but if that is not possible, then a simple donation of a slab of soft drink cans for us to sell at our fundraisers is very much appreciated and helps us to maximise profits that go right back into supporting students. Non-perishables such as tomato or barbecue sauce bottles, packets of serviettes and 600 ml water bottles are also helpful. If you are connected with a butcher or bakery locally, we can always use sausages and bread rolls although due to their perishable nature, we would need these on the day of an event rather than to store.

Our next P&C Meeting will be held on Tuesday 12 March at 7pm in the library.

Attendance - Whole and Partial Days

Just a reminder to all parents that the school has clearly defined procedures for lateness, early leave requirements and sick bay that all students are required to follow. For students who become sick during the day, they are required to inform their class teacher who will organise for them to be sent to the sick bay where a trained first aid attendant will provide support and contact parents. Children should not contact their parents directly via their mobile phones as this means that staff remain unaware of the child's medical needs, thereby stopping us from upholding our duty of care and providing children with the care they may need. Unfortunately, we have all too many occasions when a parent arrives at the sick bay to collect their child and the student is not there because they haven't reported to a staff member. This wastes everyone's time and can be easily avoided.

Any student who arrives late to school must bring a late note from their parent. Alternately, you may walk your child in to the office and sign them in or phone the office to advise that your child has just been dropped off and is on their way in. When these procedures are followed, the partial absence is recorded as "explained" as opposed to "unexplained". All unexplained partial absences result in the child being given a detention and this data is then recorded on the student's report. Partial absences also includes students who leave school early. For medical and other related appointments, we obviously prefer that you try to make these for outside of school hours however if this is unavoidable, then please send you child to school with a note explaining why they need to be allowed to leave early and what time you want them to leave. Such notes should be taken to the Deputy Principal in the morning or at Recess 1. Deputy Principals will then examine the validity of the reason using the criteria for justifiable absence set down in the Department of Education's Attendance Policy and sign the partial absence off. Clearly, students should be at school engaged in their learning for the vast majority of the time unless sick and there is clear research to support the impact of regular absences on a child's academic progression. If you have any questions about attendance, please contact your child's Year Adviser or the Deputy Principal responsible for your child's year group. I have included an interesting set of statistics about the importance of regular attendance in this edition of Parent Bulletin.

FROM THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S

Year 7 and 9 - NAPLAN Online 2019

Our school has been selected to conduct NAPLAN Online for 2019. During the transition period from paper tests to the online format, many schools are being phased into the online version. As preparation for the online test, our school will be conducting a 45-minute practice test for all Years 7 and 9 students during Week 9 of this term. This activity will provide



an opportunity for every student to experience the NAPLAN online assessment platform as well as the functionality and tools within the locked down browser. It will also provide students with an opportunity to become familiar with the types of questions they will experience in NAPLAN Online.

Year 11 - Preparing for Assessments

Year 11 have their first formal assessment period approaching soon, with some subjects already having assignments in progress. The formal assessment period means that key assessment tasks are due for each senior subject throughout the 3 weeks (Weeks 9-11). Students are urged to show the drafts of their work to their teachers to seek guidance. This will allow them ample time to make adjustments before the final due date.

Subject Changes Closed

During the first 4 weeks of this term, there have been quite a lot of Year 9 and 11 students approach me to make small changes to their pattern of electives. As in most schools, any period of changes must be restricted as the early work completed in classrooms during the term is vital for the first assessment task and if students were to change at too late a stage, they would not be able to attempt the first task. Thank you to a great many students who consulted carefully and made the appropriate changes within the required timeframe. Any further changes are now no longer possible.

BYOD Changes Ahead

At the recent Year 6 Information Evening I announced that from 2020 all Year 7 students will be expected to participate in our BYOD program. I have also recently had enquiries from current Year 7 families about our policy regarding BYOD. All students in the school are invited to participate in the current BYOD program and can do so by completing the Student Agreement Form and returning it to Mr Quinlan in the library. Elderslie High School held the annual 6 into 7 Information Evening on Tuesday, 23 February. On this evening

prospective students and their parents participated in a tour of the school followed by an information session. All faculties participated in presenting to students and parents as part of the tour and they were able to see some of our facilities and learn a little about the subjects students will participate in when they are in Year 7. Our Year 11 prefects were extremely effective tour guides and highlighted the leadership capability of students at Elderslie High School. Our School Captains and Prefects also represented the school on the evening. Thank you to the P&C who had a major presence with running a fund raising BBQ and our newly elected president, Mr Nick Maglis spoke to parents in the information session. I would like to thank all the members of our community who contributed to making the evening a great success.

Bicycle Safety

Many of our students ride their bikes and scooters to school. I would like to encourage parents to discuss with their children the safety requirements necessary for riding on public roads. Students are required to abide by the road rules and wear a helmet to and from school. They are also required to dismount once they enter the school grounds and leave their bike or scooter in the bike rack behind the Principal's office.



Toilets

Elderslie High School has a number of toilet blocks and it is essential that students use the correct toilet block for their age group. We have toilets in different areas of the school for junior, middle school and senior students. The Year 7 and 8 toilets are located above the canteen, the Year 9 and 10 toilets are located in the HSIE block, and the Year 11 and 12 toilets are near the Art classrooms. Each of the entry doors has a clearly labelled sign indicating the year groups permitted to use the toilet. If the toilets are locked students should report this to the student office. Students needing to use a toilet are required to report to the student office with permission from their teacher unless they have a toilet pass. All toilet blocks are locked during class time and as there is a break after every lesson the need to go during class time is reduced.



Online Gaming

Many of our students participate in online gaming. It is essential that parents provide guidance to their child when participating in online group games such as Fortnite Battle Royale. The following tips may help parents to provide appropriate guidance:

- 1. Take an active interest in the games your child is playing.
- 2. Find out who they play with online and what kind of language is being used. Make sure they report abusive or anti-social behaviour.
- 3. Use App store ratings to make sure your child is playing age appropriate games.
- 4. Agree to boundaries and limit the time allocated to gaming.
- 5. Teach your children to protect themselves by thinking critically, not to share personal information or add gaming friends to other social networking platforms.
- 6. Never give your child access to your PayPal password.

I have provided these tips as I have become aware that coercion and bullying often happens online during group games. Some vulnerable children have been coerced into giving away their gaming points and even access to their parents PayPal accounts. Children often do this to be accepted by the group, especially if they have low self-confidence and self-esteem. Our student Wellbeing Team also organises presentations by Brainstorm Productions and the Police Liaison Officer every year to educate students about cyber safety.
